HIGHLIGHTS

Heming Hu wins an Australian Singles Title for 4th year in a row

In winning the Under 18 Australian Singles title, Heming has now won an Australian Singles Title for the 4th successive year and now surely becomes one of the best juniors of the last 30 years. In 2007 Heming won U13 & 15 then 2008 won U15 again then 2009 made it a three-peat in U15 and now in 2010 the U18 Singles Title. It's now a total of 10 (5 Singles and 5 doubles) Australian titles for Heming. He is now striving for a higher level. Heming plans on spending majority of 2011 training in China which should see him improve at the International junior level then commence what could be a great senior career where he is already pushing the top 10 in Australia.

Lily Phan wins Australian Doubles Titles

Lily won another 2 doubles titles (U18 Girls with Ci Ci Zhong & U15 Mixed with Dillon Cathcart) taking her total to 7 Australian Doubles Titles. This now makes 11 Australian Titles and still has 3 years left as a junior. By the end of her junior career Lily could have a record that is comparable with all the top Australian Juniors in the history of the sport. Lily was also r-up in U18 & U15 Girls Singles while in 2009 was R-up in U18, won U15, 2008 won U13 & 15 and 2007 r-up U13 & 15.

Yang Shen wins Australian Doubles Titles

12 year old Yang had a fantastic Aust. Championships, winning 2 doubles titles. He won U15 Boys with Dillon Cathcart and U13 Mixed with Wendy Li. This is just reward for Yang who 15 months ago was so far out of contention for such titles but with a lot of hard work (playing 15 – 25 hours per week for last 15 months) and dedication has improved that much where he now has 2 Australian Titles. Yang, together with Dominic Huang, is currently in China for 3 months training.

Dominic Huang wins Australian Doubles Title

12 year old Dominic won the U13 Boys Doubles with Leon Suy. They were the number 1 seeds and defeated the number 2 seeds, Daniel Zou & Lawrence Qiu, in the Final. Dominic also made the SF of the U13 Boys Singles. This is a deserved Aust. title for Dominic and I feel it's the start of something special over next 3-4 years and think he could be a top 10 U15 player on the world level if he can increase (double from now) his playing hours each week and get enough financial assistance from Club/Association, State & National level. He is currently in China with Yang for 3 months training.

Daniel Zou makes final of Australian U13 Singles

Daniel has made steady improvement over the last 4 years and had a fantastic National's which saw him make the final of U13 Boys Singles but was unable to overcome Jake Duffy (QLD) losing 4-1. Daniel was also r-up in the U13 Boys Doubles. I'm sure this will inspire him to strive for higher levels as he moves to U15 next year and could be a strong contender for the Singles title if improves enough.

David Powell regains form at Australian Closed

After missing out on making the Commonwealth Games Team, David bounced back to make the SF Australian Closed Men's Singles losing to the winner William Henzell. David defeated George Tang, 4-2, in Rd. 16 and Robert Frank, 4-2, in QF. This was not only a good result on paper for David but, to me, another testament to his mental strength. He was very disappointed and bit disillusioned with TT just one month prior to this tournament, after missing out on the Commonwealth Games & World Team Cup which 8 different players made a Team, but showed he can be a force in 2011 and beyond.

Lily lost to Anna Du in the final of U18 Girls Singles at Australian Championships in the 7 set after leading 3 sets to 1. This was the 4th time Lily and Anna have played against each other in an Australian Singles final. A great rivalry that I hope continues for many more years. This is the 2nd year in a row Lily has lost the final of U18 Girls Singles in the 7th set which is heartbreaking yet a privilege at same time.

HANDY HINTS

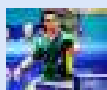

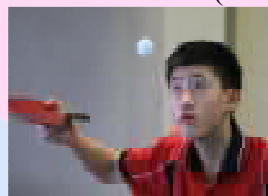

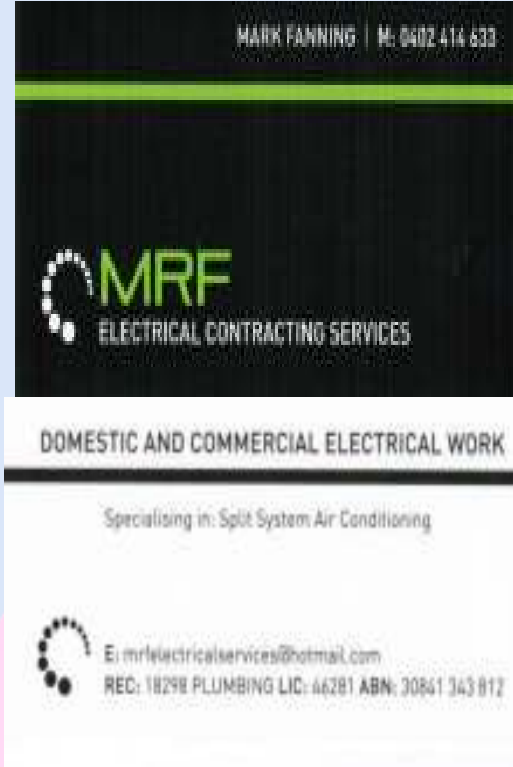
